PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Saints of Immanuel,

Have you ever felt paralyzed? You know what I am talking about: that deer in the headlights frozen in our track's moment. Yet, if there is a more frightful condition than paralysis then as of this writing, I cannot think of it. It was for a good reason that the nation was gripped by the story of Christopher Reeve, Superman, incapacitated by a freak fall from a horse. But then, this sort of thing happens all too often. I think of two of our members who are full of wit, life, and joy, their bodies ravaged, but their minds at more than full strength.



There is a story in the Bible that I am reminded of that go along these same lines. It's the story of Jesus passing by the pool at Bethesda, a place where people hoped upon hope for miracles. And we all understand. Who would not look for healing waters, pursue every path, no matter how unlikely the success? And so it was with this man, an invalid for some 38 years. He'd been told that if he got into the pool when the waters were stirred, there was some hope, however far fetched it may have seemed to others. But there was no one there to help him, so he laid by and watched. That's the story he told our Lord when asked if he wanted to be healed. And then our Lord said simply, "Get up, take up your bed, and walk." And so, the man did.

Don't you like the bit about taking up his bed? Tidiness is encouraged. But then, our Lord seems to have made his bed too, at least he did after being laid in the tomb from Friday to Sunday. The disciples found the burial garments nicely folded. Would make Mary proud, I imagine.

But where are those miracles today? We surely shouldn't discount the miraculous advances in science and medicine that have transformed so many lives. But others remain lame, crippled, even paralyzed. And it's heart breaking, even as some inspire. But nothing is hopeless. Things change, and miracles still happen. And, if they don't happen now, they will happen fully and forever on the day of resurrection. You with aching bones and palsied limbs will skip and jump and run again.

Where does Christ's miracles ministry happen today? At the Baptismal font. There, eyes and ears are opened, faith is born and fostered, sins are washed away. But there is more. Every miracle that our

Did You Know?



We begin where we left off last month – acquiring the land to build a larger place of worship for Immanuel's growing congregation. Even though many items of the church were donated, the cost of our new church amounted to over \$165,125.00 back in 1952. In today's market, it would cost somewhere around – wait for it - \$1,801,143.00. We are truly blessed with the foresight of those that came before us!

There are different stories of how this building came to be. One story is as follows: St. Edmond Roman Catholic Church on King Charles Avenue in Rehoboth Beach, DE was a block away from the summer home of Harry Rieck, Sr. and family. They walked by the church to go downtown many times. He loved the gothic look of this beautiful church and even received permission to check out the inside and obtain the builder's name and address in Baltimore, MD.

In 1941, the congregation knew a larger church needed to be built and a building fund committee was elected so funds could be solicited. Finally, on October 24,1949, they proceeded with the building after a vote was taken by the congregation. A Building Committee was elected as follows: Harry Rieck, Sr.-Chairman, Paul Plutschak, Conrad Fuchs, Ernest Goehringer, William F. Gadow, Albert R. Krieger, Edwin Dietrich, William Kleinwachter, Henry Rosebrock, John T. Schmick, Sr., Albert Ischer, Leo Frase and Hajo Tjaden. (Continued on page 8)

Plans were drawn by the architect firm of Zink & Moehle. They sold items that would not be needed for the new church and thought they may need around \$120,000.00 to build. They had roughly half, thanks to pledges and sales. The Building Committee awarded the contract the Lawrence Construction Company in Baltimore, MD on August 1, 1950. On August 13, ground was broken with a special service with 223 in attendance.

Construction began on October 1, 1950. The church was built with North Carolina's Mount Airy Granite. On May 20, 1951, enough progress was made that a cornerstone laying could take place – a treasured moment for Immanuel! The 3:30 pm service was conducted by Rev, A.J. Stiemke from Church of Our Savior in Baltimore. He was the nephew of the pastor who conducted services before the congregation was organized. Two hundred fifty people attended this service. The cornerstone was laid by three men: Harry Rieck, Sr., President of the congregation, Lawrence Baziano, representing the contractor and Pastor Louis Geiger, our minister during this time. A sealed copper box was placed in the cornerstone and holds the following items: a Lutheran Hymnal, Luther's Small Catechism, a copy of the Lutheran Witness, minutes of the Building Committee, a complete membership list, officers and committees of the congregation, a copy of the Preston News and Farmer and church bulletins.

By January, 1951, memorials by either individuals or families were committed for all of the stained-glass windows, hymn boards and chancel furnishings. The gifts by our members were so generous. The week of September 14, 1951, the concrete floor of the undercroft was poured. By the spring of 1952, the church building was almost completed. The pews were in place and waiting for the pulpit, altar, lectern rail and hymnals to be in place. The electronic organ was installed in February of 1952 and on March 30, dedication services were held. In the morning service that day, the keys to the church were presented by the architect to Pastor Geiger, who unlocked the door. The doors were opened by the chairman of the building committee and the processional by the visiting clergy, the Church Council, choir members and congregation. An afternoon service was also held.

God truly blessed Immanuel by giving us Pastor Louis Geiger as their minister from 1917 until 1955.
