### PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Dearly beloved,

Why do we have church on Christmas? I'll be honest, the first time I heard that Lutherans attend church on Christmas, I felt sorry for them. I mean after all, it's Christmas. There is food to eat, presents to open, movies to watch, eggnog to consume, and grandparents homes to visit (and the presents that are there). And, besides we are out of school and off work, why not just enjoy it without having to add one more thing, that is church, to the already full Christmas day schedule.



So why do we have church on Christmas? It's true not everyone does. The church I grew up in (prior to being Lutheran) did not. Maybe we'd have a Christmas Eve service but we'd not be in the pews on the day we celebrate the birth of our Lord. And we weren't alone. A lot of churches in Christendom do not have services on Christmas day.

Truth is, having services on Christmas day is a matter of religious liberty within the church. Meaning that it's not commanded by God that we do it nor is it forbidden to do so. It's what we call "adiaphora", meaning that it's neither commanded nor forbidden. Thus, if we chose not to have church on Christmas, our souls will not be damned and God isn't going to strike us down with bolts of lightening.

So this month, I wanted to just take a few moments and consider the question, why do we have church on Christmas?

The first thing I'd like us to consider is that having church on Christmas is all about Jesus. Regardless of the commercialism of Christmas, the jolly elf from the North Pole and his nine reindeer (yes, I included Rudolph), the traveling, food, and family gatherings; nothing will change the fact that Christmas is about God becoming incarnate. Think about that. God created all things in 6 days. The same God sent His Son into the world and in the womb of a virgin, God became flesh. How cool is that! Christmas is about God, Immanuel, with us.

Look no further than the local church's rendition of the Christmas story and you'll see, not twinkling lights on a tree surrounded with presents, but a tired mom, a nervous dad, and a cooing baby in a

manger. It's the true story of Christmas, given to us by the prophet Isaiah, and followers of the Babe of Bethlehem in St. Matthew and St. Luke's Gospels.

A second thing I'd like us to consider is that having church on Christmas is for sinners. Listen again to these familiar verses from St. Luke's Gospel, "And the angel said to them, 'Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11). A Savior. Savior of what? Sinners. That is why He came, to save sinners, that is to save you and me and the whole world. For had it not been for sin, we'd not need a Savior to come for us. And just because it's Christmas doesn't mean we hit a pause button on sin. We sin daily. The old Adam in us raises his ugly head and left to ourselves, we'd succumb to him. But, God loves us so much that He came on Christmas to be our Savior, to die on the cross and in doing so, to forgive our sins, and make us sons and daughters of God.

On Christmas day, consider it another way, "For unto you, here this day, in the place where we gather, we receive our Savior who is Christ the Lord." We receive Him in Word, and in Holy Communion. Another name for Holy Communion is the Mass. Christ-Mass, or Christmas. For sinners.

A third thing I'd like us to consider as it pertains to having church on Christmas is that at Christmas, we lift our heads and see the cross of Good Friday. In the church year, Holy Week and Easter come about four months after the celebration of Christmas. In a short period of time we go from riding a donkey into Bethlehem to give birth to a Savior, to the Savior riding a donkey into Jerusalem to die for the sins of the world, giving a new birth to those who believe.

I understand this may not be as easy to hear because it seems to 'take away from' the joy of Christmas and yet the message doesn't change. Christmas points to Easter. And it must. The babe in the manger will become the risen Savior of the empty tomb. There is no way around it. Nor should there ever be one without the other.

Yet as hard as it may be to consider Easter at Christmas, it Continued on Page 3

should instead give us great joy and a reason to sing. Yes! God comes for us! And He came to die for us! Praise the Lord for that. In His coming, we have hope because in His death our sins are forgiven. I don't know about you but that is certainly something we can celebrate together on Christmas day. "God tell it on the mountain, over the hills and everywhere. Go tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born". Tell it, sing it, receive it, live it! O come, o come, Emmanuel!

Finally, having church on Christmas is also a matter of tradition. Traditions don't have to be bad things and coming to church together as a family on Christmas is certainly a tradition worth having. I understand that it's not tradition for everyone, maybe even for you. If your tradition is to gather with family and celebrate the day together, then wonderful! What a beautiful tradition to have. Pastor's family does that too. But as you gather this month, I challenge you to consider adding attending church on Christmas day to your traditions! You wont regret it and you'll receive a gift better than anything you could ever put a ribbon on, that is, the gift of God's Word and Sacrament.

God bless you saints. O come let us adore Him, Christ the Lord. Amen.


