### Dearly Beloved,

By time you read this article, I will be at home recovering from gastric bypass surgery. This month I wanted to just share my journey with you and to look at a couple of spiritual takeaways.

I've always enjoyed food. As such, I've also always struggled with my weight, even while I was in the Army. I have learned that I "stress eat" meaning that when I am stressed, I eat. That type of eating I now know is not good for me and, coupled with the fact that due to my injuries from the military I am not able, as I'd like to be, to work out more, the weight just piled on. Today, I am ashamed and embarrassed by how much weight I have gained over the years.



Desiring to live a better, healthier life, I decided to have weight loss surgery. I won't lie, it's been a tough journey. There have been appointments with cardio, gastroenterology, mental health, dieticians, the surgeon, and more. Each part of the process and each designed to prepare me for the lifestyle changes that are to come.

So, on January 23, I will have the surgery. Some of you have asked how I am doing? I won't lie, mental health wise, it's been up and down. Part of me doesn't want to have the surgery. However, the pros outweigh the cons, and I know that having the procedure done will greatly benefit me and my family and, Lord willing, I will be alive to see my grandchildren. So, I ask that you pray for me and my family during this time. That God will lay His healing hand upon me and that He will give us a little more grace, comfort, healing, and peace.

So, what are the things I want you to take away from my story this month? One, we are not in control when it comes to God. He is the architect of our lives. He gave us life and He knows when we will take our last breath. It's hard for me to not have control over things, particularly in this situation, and when I don't, it's stressful. But just as God stood in the boat, stretched out His hand and calmed the seas, I know He has authority over this and will give me calm and you as well as you face the trials and tribulations of your life.

Second, on your good days and on your bad ones, cast all your worries onto the Lord. That's what He is there for. This has been hard for me during this time leading up to my surgery. I know I should, and I've prayed about it earnestly and will continue to, but it's letting go and letting God that I have struggled with. Thanks be to God though that He loves me and that His grace is sufficient for me because without it, I would be lost and that is not a good place to be. Friend, God has you. He came for you. He took your sins upon Himself on the cross and He died for them there. In doing so, He gives you forgiveness, grace, new life, and the promise that He is indeed, with you always, even to the ends of the age.

Lastly, pray. The Apostle Paul says that we are to pray without ceasing. Take everything to the Lord in prayer. There is nothing He doesn't want to hear. Nothing is too big or small for Him. He loves and adores you and cares about you immensely. When you pray, just be yourself. Talk to the Lord as if you were talking to a friend, a neighbor, or dare I say, your Father who art in heaven. You don't have to use big words or phrases, just speak from the heart. He is listening. And when the words won't come, know that He sees you and He hears you even when your words are silent or run down your cheek as tears.

Thank you beloved for allowing me to share with you this month. It is the greatest joy of my life to be your pastor, and I love each and every one of you so very dearly. As I pray, I will remember all of you by name and fondly and I look forward to seeing God answer those prayers for you in your life.

One last request: remember my family this month. They could use a little more grace, love, and support during this time. Thank you for that. God bless you.
